

Conduct in the Hallways

Students should be in the halls only at the beginning and close of school and while moving from one class to another unless they have special permission or special duties that require them to be there. Students are asked to be courteous at all times and to keep to the right when moving in the halls. Running and shouting in the hall are never permitted.

Cubbies or Lockers

Cubbies or lockers will be assigned to students by homeroom teachers and/or office designees. Although a student may have control of his locker against his fellow students, his possession is not exclusive. The school policy is to reserve the right to search a student's locker. Any locker search must be approved by the principal. He/She will authorize such a search if there is reason to believe (reasonable suspicion) that something is concealed there that is detrimental or harmful to the student or other students, or something that is illegal. Students should use only the lockers assigned to them. There is a minimal charge for locker use at the high school level.

Student Driving Policy

Students will be permitted to drive to school in accordance with the following regulations:

1. Student must present a valid Alabama Driver's License and proof of current liability insurance.
2. Students must purchase and display a valid school parking permit. (These are purchased in the school office.)
3. Vehicle must be parked in prescribed parking area.
4. Students must leave automobiles secured (locked) until 3:00 p.m.
5. No student will be permitted in the car during the time it is parked. Students must have written permission from the office to go to the automobile between 7:50 and 3:00.
6. Students are expected to observe all traffic laws. They should especially observe caution while driving to and from school. School buses are traveling the same roads.
7. Students should not remain in cars after arriving on campus, and are not to leave campus once they arrive.
8. Abuse of the above policies will be judged by the administration, and driving privileges may be suspended or revoked in regard to the Meek School campuses.

School Buses

Misbehavior on the bus creates a very real danger to the safety and comfort of others. Bus rules are posted near the driver of each bus. Children must observe safety regulations in order to continue riding to and from school. The Winston County Board of Education is not obligated to transport anyone. Pupil transportation is a privilege and a convenience. It is conditional upon good behavior and strict obedience to these rules.

Office permission is necessary for a student to ride a bus other than the one assigned. Permission will be given only if the child has a note from the parents stating the reason for
